Title		ASPIRATIONS AND THE SOCIOECONOMIC ENVIRONMENT
Goals		<ul> <li>It is well documented that the socioeconomic environment influences behaviour, attitudes, and values. From early childhood, children brought up in a poor environment observe socio-economic failures such as poor living conditions, liquidity constraints, high unemployment and low educational levels attained by adults around them. This can result in the narrative of fatalism – "it's not worth trying" – prevalent in societies that experience failure.</li> <li>This dissertation focuses on the relationship between aspirations (generally defined as a person's expectations, goals, and claims on</li> </ul>
		<ul> <li>his/her own future achievement) and the socioeconomic environment.</li> <li>Living in poor socioeconomic conditions contributes to the failure to aspire to one's own potential. At the same time, low capacity to aspire is one of the potential causes of persistent poverty. Aspirations are thus believed to play an essential role in the psychology of poverty.</li> <li>The main goal of the thesis is to examine the relationship between aspirations and the socioeconomic environment.</li> </ul>
		<ul> <li>The prospective doctoral student may decide whether he or she wishes to work with available secondary microdata or design own (experimental) data collection.</li> <li>The expected contribution of the dissertation lies in providing new empirical evidence on how aspirations are potentially affected by</li> </ul>
