YOUNG PEOPLE AT THE FOREFRONT OF GLOBAL PEACEBUILDING



The pursuit of peace must be universal in order for it to be truly lasting, this includes young people, despite often facing a lack of inclusion within formal peacebuilding efforts and responses.

Understandably, young people often feel they lack resources and experience in the development of peace efforts. The exposure to instability, war, conflict, human rights violations and terror can create immense anxiety, a feeling of overwhelming defeat and ultimately self-doubt that one's individual contribution will never be enough to challenge systemic structures of inequality and injustice. When even the most experienced practitioners in the field face continuous setbacks in their striving towards peace, it can feel as though no one will ever be able to eliminate conflict, let alone a young person.

The new global challenges brought by the twenty-first century also means the goal of global peace is threatened in evolving ways, with the antagonists to peace being more silent, invisible and structural in character. Yet, new challenges offer the potential for revolutionary solutions. Young people possess enormous, but often unrecognised, leadership potential and will play an important role in the future of peacebuilding.

In spite of the necessity of foregrounding the views, perspectives and goals of young people in global peacebuilding, as an educator, helping your students to gain knowledge and confidence can feel like a huge responsibility. Therefore, you may be looking for the right resources and platforms to more effectively lead and mentor your students to be the future leaders of tomorrow. At Humanitarian Affairs Asia our programmes are designed to address the disparity between the reality of lacking resources, funds and networks necessary to make the global social change young people desire, and their ultimate ambitions for building a better world for themselves and the wider global community.

SPEAKERS HIGHLIGHTS

Most of us recall childhood memories of playing with friends in the playground, but not Ayik Chut Deng. As a young boy, Ayik fought as a child soldier in Ethiopia and Sudan. He witnessed unspeakable violence and was regularly tortured by the older boys.

At the age of nineteen, Ayik escaped to Australia where he ended up as a refugee. However, adjusting to a new life in Australia was far more difficult than he anticipated. Ayik was suffering from chronic and misdiagnosed mental health issues leading to years of erratic behavior. He even got into trouble with the law before coming to the realization that his behavior was putting his life, as well as the lives of his loved ones, at risk.

Today, Ayik is a father, actor and volunteers at his local youth center. Overcoming his childhood of indescribable horror became a lifelong process of learning and healing. Ayik Chut Deng will reveal the lessons learnt from his **painful childhood as a child soldier**.

The name "Boko Haram" means "Western education is forbidden". It is a terrorist organization based in north-eastern Nigeria.

At a tender age, Imrana Alhaji Buba saw horrifying acts of terrorism inflicted by the terrorist group. His family was directly affected by the bombings and his father was murdered in cold blood.

Far from becoming intimidated by the violence, Imrana founded the Youth Coalition Against Terrorism (now Youth Initiative Against Terrorism), a volunteer-based youth-led organization working to unite youth against violent extremism in north-eastern Nigeria. He started with nothing. He had zero budget. But he was passionate and wanted to do something to stop the acts of terror. Now, his organization has 46 chapters throughout North-eastern Nigeria.

Imrana's message for young leaders considering to become agents of change: **"Start now. You don't need to wait. Peace is a language we all speak."**

Afghanistan, Iraq and Haiti. These are the countries where Derek Schwartz was deployed to as a United States Marine. There, he experienced the insurmountable horror of war first-hand while serving his country.

After returning from his deployment, Derek suffered from post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD) and his coping mechanism was alcohol. He was haunted by the brutal scenes he had witnessed and the lives that were taken by him and others. Fortunately, Derek met a medical practitioner that encouraged him to seek professional treatment – that person is now his wife, Linsey.

In order to avoid future wars and conflict, Derek believes that the current and the next generation of world leaders need to be instructed on the importance of peace building. It is critical to fully grasp the effects of war, not only on the individual but also on nations, in order to fully comprehend the importance of peace among nations. Derek will share his **experience in the war zones and vision in peace building.**

“Schools are for boys only”. At the age of six, not willing to be denied her education, Rahila tried to find a way to go to school, just like the boys in her town. Bravely, she dressed up like a boy in an attempt to go unnoticed. Her life, and that of her family, were threatened by the Taliban rulers when she was found out.

Rahila Haidary has a deep and personal connection to the importance of peace building and education. Growing up in the Uruzgan province of Afghanistan, then under Taliban rule, Rahila and her family survived the Hazara Genocide, wars and conflicts.

In 2011, Rahila travelled to Australia as an asylum seeker. Now, she is dedicating her life to advocate for peace. A UNICEF Australia Young Ambassador, Rahila Haidary, will inspire and empower you with her story of **harrowing escape from Afghanistan and becoming a catalyst for female economic empowerment.**

Growing up as a young person in Palestine, Sulaiman Khatib did not view peace as an option. He was raised in a war zone.

At the age of fourteen, Sulaiman joined the “Fatah” movement and began his violent struggle for freedom. He went as far as attempting to steal guns from Israeli soldiers, landing him a 15 year sentence in a juvenile prison, recounted horrendous cruelty and torture in the cells. An opportunity to work in the prison library presented a paradigm shift for Sulaiman. Through his journey of self-directed learning and discovery, Sulaiman realised that there are multiple narratives to conflict. He had mistaken his enemy, instead they both shared a common enemy- one of hatred and of fear.

Sulaiman would go on to become Co-Founder and Director of Combatants for Peace, an organization composed of Palestinians and Israelis who have participated in the circle of violence towards each other but have instead chosen to reject it and to work together. Sulaiman Khatib’s journey teaches you that there is an alternative to violence. **Together we can bring peace, but the change must first start within us.**

In 1990, when Zak Ebrahim was only seven years old, his father became the first known Islamic jihadist to take a life on American soil. El-Sayyid Nosair has shot and killed the leader of the Jewish Defence League.

While in prison, Nosair helped plan the bombing of the World Trade Center in 1993. In one of his infamous video messages, Osama bin Laden urged the world to “Remember El-Sayyid Nosair.”

For Zak, a childhood of terrorism was all he knew. After his father’s incarceration, his family moved more than twenty times, hunted and persecuted for the crimes of his father.

Growing up, Zak could never adopt the views of his father. As he grew older, he was able to gain a deeper grasp of his horrific actions. This led to a firm conviction in the desire to promote peace. Zak would later go on to write the book “The Terrorist’s Son” detailing his **incredible journey in finding his own path, a path away from hate.**

BEFORE ATTENDING THE PEACE SUMMIT

Dyana Satya Moitinho Freitas knew she wanted to make a difference *“I wanted to help transform the lives of refugees around the world,”* but she didn't know how she would make that difference. She decided to attend the 2020 Peace Summit – a decision she would later describe as a *“life-changing”* experience.

DURING THE PEACE SUMMIT

“I can genuinely say that I have just participated in one of the most humbling experiences of my life. It is a few experiences that make you see the world in a new way, whilst simultaneously structuring bridges of support and resources. Thus, enabling the realisation of the ideal world's existent in our imaginaries.”

The speakers and the organisers at the Peace Summit at the UN Bangkok have shown us what the path to peace should and can look like. No matter your race, religion, gender, sexuality - every human has the right to dignity, to freedom. I cannot share with you all what four days of immersion in peace talks, workshops, interactions, and more, we're like. I can only tell you what has been the most inspiring and life-changing of all, which is, all of the beautiful humans that I met from 55 countries.”

AFTER THE PEACE SUMMIT

After attending the 2020 Peace Summit for Emerging Leaders Dyana Satya Moitinho Freitas was inspired in the pursuit to provide stable employment to refugees, volunteering as Project Director of a research and design team at Enactus, at the University of Sydney.

“Our team of volunteers have come up with the RANA project, which stands for Refugees Are Never Alone, where we will provide stable employment to refugees to create handmade artisan products such as cotton t-shirts featuring refugees' arts, designs and messages. May we all inspire and make the world the best possible place we can be, in our journey as Peace Ambassadors.”

THE PACKAGE

Venue: The Peace Summit will be held at the United Nations Conference Center (UNCC) in Bangkok, Thailand. The UNCC serves as one of the headquarters for the UN Economic and Social Commission for Asia and the Pacific.

THE IMPACT

The Peace Summit gives young people the tools and knowledge to succeed in fighting for a more peaceful future as a Humanitarian Affairs Peace Ambassador. This role is a unique opportunity offered to delegates following their attendance at the summit. The role is voluntary and is a one-year self-directed initiative that allows delegates to serve in the promotion of peace efforts in their own community. Delegates will have the opportunity to gain valuable insight from heart-wrenching stories told by speakers, experts and activists, participate in workshops and challenges and network with like-minded peers. They will leave feeling empowered to take action and to instigate change, leading the way forward for other young people as an instrument for peace.
