









NGARY

While situated in the center of Europe, Hungary has the unique feature of being a highly accessible and affordable country. Hungary also has an exceptional cultural life: world-famous festivals, such as Sziget Festival or Balaton Sound, as well as unique exhibitions are all around the corner for you to enjoy.

Despite its relatively small size, the country is home to numerous World Heritage Sites, UNESCO Biosphere Reserves, the second largest thermal lake in the world (Lake Hévíz), the largest lake in Central Europe (Lake Balaton), and the largest natural grassland in Europe (Hortobágy).

At the same time Hungary is also one of the safest countries in Europe: according to the Global Peace Index of 2021, Hungary is the 19th safest country in the world allowing you to fully focus on your work and leisure activities.





The vibrant city is a political, administrative, cultural and sports hub, drawing around 30 million tourists each year through a wide range of cultural programs and magnificent attractions, with Buda located on the Western side and Pest on the Eastern side of the river **Danube**.



Locals are friendly and easy to approach, and the city itself is safe. Compared to other major European cities, the cost of living in Budapest is low. Hungary's currency is Forint (HUF) and at the time of this publication, €1= 410 Ft. Like in most other countries, the capital is more expensive compared to the countryside, but everyday costs such as housing, groceries or a dinner out all fall within a reasonable price range.
