The work will point out the differences between the statutory and effective tax rates and further analyze the methods and determinants of the impact on tax competitiveness in corporate taxation in EU member states. Last but not least, the work will evaluate the impact of individual determinants on tax competitiveness concerning the structure of tax systems of individual countries, which are heterogeneous and lead to differences and competition between EU countries.

In addition to providing relevant data to ensure the stability of the economic environment, they are closely linked to issues of sustainability, security and self-sufficiency of countries in terms of agricultural production and related food production, as necessary commodities to ensure the nutrition of the population. The dissertation thesis will focus on the analysis and comparison of current composite indicators to predict the impact of the business cycle on the agri-sector, analysis of their predictive ability within the European Union, analysis of the impact of available factors on the business cycle, and in the last part a proposal of a leading composite indicator for EU countries.

In addition to expanding the current state of knowledge, the research results will be transferable to the real environment of data services and policies in the field of public procurement, antitrust and monitoring, etc.</p> <p>The main goal of the thesis is to diagnose, predict and analyze the impacts of non-standard practices in public and commercial procurement using data science and behavioral research and data living lab development as well as to analyze the potential of large data for the required level of prediction performance, classification and causal methods.</p>

Title		STRUCTURAL CHANGES AND IMPACTS OF FOREIGN TRADE IN THE CENTRAL AND EASTERN EUROPE COUNTRIES
Detailed description of the topic (annotation or abstract)		<p>The Covid 19 pandemic crisis, which was a huge shock to world trade and global value chains, highlighted questions about the impact of change and the importance of individual sectors for each country. Some sectors was partially shut down as a result of lock-downs, so the concerns about the reactions this will have on the overall economy have been raised. As a result of global value chains, cross-sectoral links are strong not only within a country but across the region, even within countries from other continents, measures and changes introduced in one country spread across countries and may manifest themselves in different ways. After the year 2000, within the countries of Central Europe, a significant production cluster was established. This cluster is concentrated in production of industries that are strongly export-oriented. Therefore, external shocks (such as technological change, protectionism, shipping problems, etc.), which may also come from</p>

	another region, can be strongly transmitted through sectoral links and affect the domestic economy. It is possible to estimate what the impact on the economy might be if one sector completely ceased to produce as a result of the external shock. And also to show how strong are the links of one sector with the rest of the economy as well as to compare the strength of links between individual sectors and thus to evaluate their importance for a country.

Title		INTELLECTUAL CAPITAL AND PRODUCTIVITY
Detailed description of the topic (annotation or abstract)		The topic focuses on conceptualising the components of intellectual capital at the micro-and macroeconomic level. The main goal of the thesis is to define theoretically and empirically examine the impact of intangible assets in the broadest sense (intellectual capital) on the growth of productivity and economic performance of the country. The thesis's output should provide knowledge about the level of intellectual capital in the Slovak Republic in terms of human capital quality, innovation performance, ICT infrastructure and its impact on the economic and innovation performance of regions. Furthermore, the thesis will answer several research questions focused on assessing intellectual capital in the Slovak Republic and EU countries. Finally, the thesis should draft a methodological framework for uniform valuation of intellectual capital components at the regional level and define the relationship between the value of human capital and economic performance.

Detailed description of the topic (annotation or abstract)		The topic focuses on human capital and its effectiveness as one of the organization's intellectual capital components. The main goal of the research is the effectiveness of human capital in individual universities in the Slovak Republic. For this reason, in this dissertation, it is necessary to process and create your methodology for such evaluation, collect secondary and eventual primary data, and statistically evaluate, analyze and interpret the results appropriately. Several research questions are to be answered in the thesis, which focuses on evaluating human capital levels at universities in the Slovak Republic. The methodological framework for uniform evaluation of university human capital components will be proposed. The relationship between human capital value and economic performance at the university level will also be defined.

Title		SPENDING EFFICIENCY OF MUNICIPALITIES
Detailed description of the topic (annotation or abstract)		Decentralized allocation function of public finances is usually constrained legislatively and notably by the volume of municipal budgets. Budget principle of the efficiency advises the efficient use of public resources. Spending efficiency might be interpreted as ability to minimize municipality's per capita spending to keep providing a fixed level of local public goods (Afonso and Venâncio 2022). Related foreign scientific literature quantifies the spending efficiency of municipalities as efficiency scores using the DEA (Geys and Moesen 2009; Da Cruz and Marques 2014; Drew, Kortt and Dollery 2015; Afonso and Venâncio 2022, frequently used is the input oriented vrsDEA). To identify the determinants of the spending efficiency, efficiency scores are involved as dependent variables to the panel regression, while regressors are of demographic, socio-economic or institutional nature.

Title		FISCAL STRESS AND FISCAL DISCIPLINE OF MUNICIPALITIES ACCORDING TO THE SIZE CATEGORY
Detailed description of the topic (annotation or abstract)		Municipalities face the fiscal stress due to several factors as external shocks (economic and non-economic), tax reforms, demographic changes or investment projects. Fiscal stress might affect their fiscal behavior and disturb the municipalities' functioning in an important

	<p>manner. In line with the fiscal stress and fiscal discipline, the municipal indebtedness is predominantly analyzed (Ribeiro and Jorge 2014; Balaguer-Coll, Prior and Tortosa-Ausina 2016; Ehalaiye, Botica-Redmayne and Laswad 2017). It is assumed, that municipalities smaller in population face higher financial vulnerability, but their access to loans is limited by their ability to answer for a debt with future revenues. Empirical research mainly focuses on determinants of municipal indebtedness. The panel regressions are usually run with regressors of demographic, socio-economic or institutional nature. Curious is the contribution of Kluzá (2017), the municipal indebtedness is analyzed via DEA and municipalities with worsened risk profile are identified.</p>
